EDITORIAL

We deliver the tenth volume of Ciencias Psicológicas. This issue includes papers related to instruments for assessing personality, responses to a spelling program, models for costing work accidents, the scope of social dominance, social inequality, and the validity of a screening measure of psychopathology in adolescents. The Conferences, Communications and Reviews Section includes contributions referring to the therapeutic couple of psychologist and psychiatrist, an approach from the philosophy of Homologues in children's movies and a third work that focuses on researcher's misconducts and proposals to prevent and minimize them.

In this issue as in previous ones, colleagues from different Latin American countries trust us with their work, which tends to be a hallmark of our journal and enriches and expands our exchange. Argentina, Brazil, Colombia and Uruguay are represented in this first issue of 2016.

We are facing a significant increase in manuscripts seeking to be indexed and refereed in scientific journals. As a direct indicator of high-level research production, this means good news for our discipline. But it also implies a challenge, in times when the publishing world becomes increasingly professional and demanding. Science criteria must add quality and internationalization requirements of publications, in compliance with global standards and supranational evaluations.

The relevance that acquires scientific communication indicates the need for training on how and what to communicate, to achieve good synthesis and review the methodologies through which we arrive at conclusions in our studies. We encourage professors and students to incorporate the standards by which the journals are governed in order to make better use of the work and also to make their own submissions. These efforts are for them and for society, ultimate recipients of our research.
