### Abstract

The flexibilization of European labor markets, in the last twenty years, did not produce the results promised by their supporters. This article shows evidences that the flexibilization of European labor markets did not promote a decrease in unemployment rates, but only a deterioration in the Labor conditions, with the increase of precarious forms of jobs and also concentration of income. The analysis of this historical process of flexibilization of the labor laws in Europe may be taken as a warning to Latin American economists, which should reflect about an alternative to the neoliberal politics (which, in general, followed the ideas of the Washington Consensus) that were adopted in the majority of the Latin American countries since the eighties of the last century.
